

Skyview High School
Booster Club Meeting
February 11, 2009

Meeting called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Rhea Jacobson.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes for January with typing errors corrected. Motion was carried.

Treasurer's report

A donation of \$290 was received from Steve Hook from the proceeds of his business. An additional donation of \$470 was made to the girl's basketball team. We currently have approximately \$27,000 in general Booster deposits. A copy of the Treasurer's report is attached.

Grants

A grant request of \$2,400 was expected from DECA to send the students to State. Request made to Jim Condon for ASB funds was denied on the grounds that the group needs to be self funded. DECA produces its own income through the Market Place. No other grants were requested.

Mr/Miss Skyview

An Ipod Chromatic was donated to Jake Perry to help raise funds for the Mr/Ms Skyview Pageant. In keeping with current laws governing raffles and ASB functions it is not possible for a student to conduct a raffle. He has requested that the raffle be conducted through the Booster Club. Jake will get the tickets printed and the funds from the raffle will deposited into the Booster account and all proceeds will then be donated to the Make-A-Wish Foundation, the beneficiary of the Mr/Ms Skyview program. A motion was made and carried.

Mr/Ms Skyview will be hosting the Sweetheart Dinner in the commons on Thursday, February 12 from 4:30 to 7:00. The pasta dinner will include door prizes and a silent auction. The cost is \$10 per person.

Kristen Fleishauer and Carol Collura have agreed to serve as Co-Treasurers for next school year and Keith Ferderer will server as Vice-President.

Principal's Update

Kym asked the parents present to read and give feedback on a draft of the letter she intends to send out to all senior parents. A copy of the letter is attached.

The 8th grade open house had a large turnout. The incoming freshman class is estimated to be 506 students without boundary exceptions.

Quote from Superintendent, Steve Webb, on the expected State Budget shortfall, “plan for the worst, work for the best.” It is important to identify the priorities when figuring out how to deal with the shortfall. A 60-90 minute meeting to help identify faculty and parent priorities in education will be scheduled for next week.

Graduation – Eventbuilders.com will be installing three cameras in the gymnasium. These cameras will provide a live feed of graduation and other events on the internet. Other graduation details are outlined in the attached letter to the parents.

New Business
